

JOURNAL TRANSFER NETWORKS

Journal editors may recommend transferring your manuscript to a more suitable Wiley journal via our expedited referral process.

THE BENEFITS FOR YOU



Helping you to get published quicker.

If your manuscript is not accepted by your first choice journal, referrals allow you to transfer with ease to a suitable alternative Wiley journal. You are not required to reformat your manuscript before transferring. The receiving journal may then apply specific requirements if it has not adopted free-format submission.



Maintaining editorial standards and publishing quality.

All submissions to a Wiley journal, including transferred submissions, are subject to rigorous evaluation in line with clear editorial policy.



Increasing your chance of publication.

Whether you have considered open access previously or not, you may find that the broader scope of many Wiley open access titles could increase the chance of your transferred manuscript being accepted for publication.



Great journal choice - over 1,000 open access and hybrid journals.

If you are accepted for publication in a Wiley open access journal your article will be published under a Creative Commons license, and you retain the copyright.



Quick eligibility check for open access funding.

Payment of an article publication charge (APC) is required for publication in a Wiley open access journal; however, you may be eligible for funding support.*



Hassle free resubmission.

If evaluated by reviewers, the peer review reports travel with your transferred manuscript. The new journal's Editor can then appropriately consider these reports and use them in their own evaluation, improving the efficiency of the peer review process and making the process quicker for you overall.

HOW IT WORKS IN SIX STEPS



1 Notification

Your manuscript may be identified as a candidate for possible publication in another Wiley journal. You will receive a list of potential transfer options in the decision letter.



2 Initiation

You decide whether to transfer your manuscript (including peer review reports and other materials, such as data).



3 Submission

Once the transfer of the files is complete, you will receive an email request asking you to log in to the submission site's Author Center, provide any missing information unique to that journal's submission process, and complete the submission.



4 Evaluation

Your transferred manuscript will then undertake a further editorial evaluation.

Acceptance of the offer to transfer does not guarantee acceptance of your manuscript.



5 Decision

An editorial decision is taken and you will be notified of the new publishing decision.



6 Publication

If accepted, your manuscript will be published in the new journal.

*Open access funding options.

If you are interested in transferring to a Gold open access journal, or selecting an open access option in a subscription hybrid journal (OnlineOpen), you may be eligible for funding support for the article publication charge. Here are some of the options:

- Authors from developing nations receive deep discounts or complete APC waivers.
