### **Jisc-Wiley Agreement**

### FAQs for authors, for the remainder of 2021

#### **Background**

The Jisc-Wiley agreement offers UK universities read access and open access publishing in the full collection of 1,600+ Wiley journals. In 2020 this led to a 68% increase over 2019 on the number of open access articles published by authors at Jisc-affiliated institutions. The continued increase in the demand for open access publishing in 2021 has meant that as of 10 June, 4,193 articles have been published or accepted as open access.

#### Article types covered under the agreement

From 1st July 2021, Jisc is implementing temporary restrictions on the Wiley Open Access Accounts, to ensure that articles with funder requirements to publish open access can meet those requirements. This means that **only articles** with research funding from UKRI\* or the former COAF funders† will eligible under the Wiley Jisc agreement.

The funder and institution data you enter into journal submission systems and Author Services allows Wiley to recognise if your article will qualify through this route.

This restriction will last until January 1<sup>st,</sup> 2022 when the 2022 funds become available.

# **Alternative funding availability**

If your research was not funded by one of the above, your institution may have alternative funds available to them to support your open access publication.

The funder and institution data you enter and/or confirm in journal submission systems and Author Services allows Wiley to recognise if your article may qualify through this alternative route, and Wiley alerts your institution's administrator for them to approve (or decline) your article for open access publication from their funds – you don't need to do anything additional to make this happen.

If your institution agrees to pay the fees your article will be made open access.


If your article can't be funded by either the Jisc-agreement or alternative institutional routes, you are still able to make your article available for all to read by paying the APCs yourself, and you now qualify for 25% discount in APCs.

If you are publishing in a hybrid journal your institution administrator will give you the code needed to claim this discount. This needs to be entered **after acceptance** in Author Services.



If you are publishing in a Gold open access journal simply select **UK/Jisc authors** in the discounting section **during submission**, for the discount to be applied.
