

# The Wiley and ResearchGate **CONTENT SYNDICATION PILOT**

## Overview for Authors

### What is it?

Wiley and ResearchGate are partnering on a pilot initiative where we are innovating and experimenting with making full-text articles from Wiley journals easily accessible directly on ResearchGate, making it easier for you to share your research without worrying about copyright rules or restrictions.

### Why are Wiley and ResearchGate experimenting with new access options?

Wiley and ResearchGate share the same goal of advancing research communication and facilitating the discovery of and access to high-quality research. By working together on this new initiative, we're making it easier for you to share the final version of your work, automatically, and for researchers to access it, whether they're on or off campus.

### What period does the pilot cover?

Content from Wiley journals participating in the pilot will start being uploaded to ResearchGate in April 2021, and the pilot will continue for one year. If the pilot is successful, we plan to expand it further, with additional Wiley journals participating and more Wiley research available on ResearchGate.

### Which journals are included?

The first stage of the pilot will include 17 gold open access journals published by Wiley. You can find the full list [here](#). The second stage of the pilot, later this year, will include 85 subscription and hybrid open access journals published by Wiley.

### Key features:

1. Wiley will automatically upload and make available the final, published articles from participating journals on ResearchGate.
2. For subscription articles you've published with Wiley, users will be able to automatically authenticate and access your research based on their ResearchGate profile and IP address.
3. The full-text version of your articles will be available on ResearchGate, alongside related content and users' personalized discovery feeds.
4. Your published articles will be automatically linked with your profile so you can track the impact and reach of your research directly from your ResearchGate profile.

### Key benefits:

1. You'll be able to easily share your research on ResearchGate without worrying about copyright rules or spending time responding to full-text access requests.
2. Readers can access your final, published article that has been peer reviewed, copyedited, and formatted—the same version available on Wiley Online Library—directly on ResearchGate, whether on or off campus.
3. More readers will be able to discover and access your research directly on ResearchGate. Your research will be seen within users' personalized discovery feeds, in context, by readers in your field—growing your impact and improving your interactions with other users.
4. See who is citing your work, track early interest in your work through detailed stats on article views and recommendations from verified ResearchGate users, with the assurance that readers are viewing the final, peer reviewed, and copyedited version of your article.
